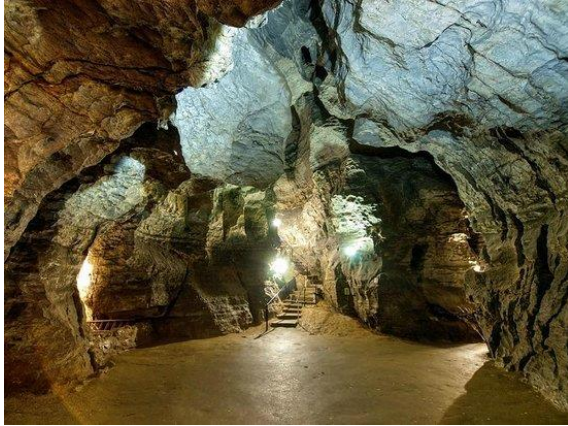

You are welcome to picnic in the garden, there are no signs saying 'keep off the grass', and dogs on leads are also very welcome. From milking demonstrations and the daily animal handling sessions, to fabulous water play and spiral slides, there is something for everyone. 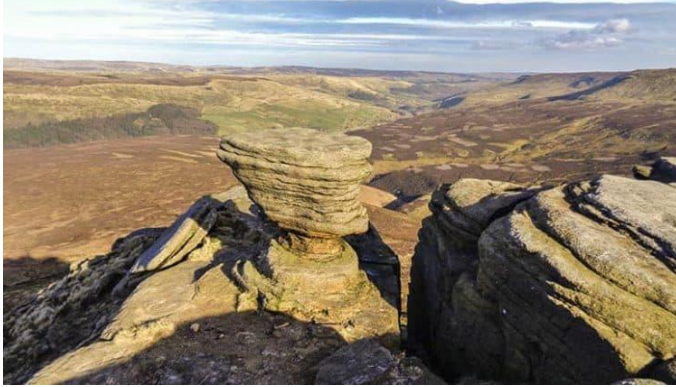

As the highest point in the Peak District, Kinder Scout boasts unforgettable views, unique moorland and even a waterfall. It offers some of the most challenging but rewarding walks in the Peak District, where you'll encounter gentle streams, dark gritstone, steep rocks to scramble up, unique peat and the glorious Kinder Downfall. Points of interest include a serene Mermaid's Pool and interesting rock formations such as Pym's Chair and the Boxing Gloves. Kinder Scout is known for its challenging walks and the Kinder Plateau can be a difficult place to navigate in poor weather conditions. With this in mind, always wear appropriate clothing and make sure to bring a map, compass and some good walking boots.

LADYBOWER RESERVOIR ☀️

Ladybower Reservoir is a large Y-shaped reservoir in the Upper Derwent Valley, at the heart of the Peak District National Park. The reservoir was built between 1935 and 1943, and was officially opened by King George VI on 24th September 1945. The reservoir is surrounded by stunning countryside with magnificent views of water, woodland and moorland. The area is a magnet for outdoor-lovers and there many circular walking and cycling routes nearby, plus stunning viewpoints such as Bamford Edge. Visit for a day of walking and don't forget to pack your bags to enjoy a respite with a lunch with a breath-taking view.

The aquarium occupies what was once the Matlock Bath Hydro. It still contains its fine stone staircase and large thermal pool, though now the pool is home to a large collection of different types of carp. The old, upstairs consulting rooms have tanks full of native, tropical and marine fish. Also housed here is a Hologram Gallery which exhibits 3 dimensional pictures using laser technology and a Petrifying Well where objects dipped into the well acquire a hard coat of lime and look as if they have been turned to stone.

The imposing ruins of Peveril Castle stand high above the pretty village of Castleton in the heart of Derbyshire's Peak District. Mentioned in the Domesday survey, Peveril Castle is one of England's earliest Norman fortresses. The keep was built by Henry II in 1176. A climb to the castle at the top of the hill to enjoy the breath-taking views over the Hope Valley is a highlight of a family day out in Castleton. Explore the remains of the keep including the garderobe (medieval lavatory).
